The good news is that there has been a reduction in reported crime in the area this month, and especially the fact there were no housebreakings, either to domestic or business premises. What is disappointing though is that once again vandalism tops the chart with a slight increase in the cases reported last month.

Car Crime

1045-2025 11th Property was stolen from an insecure boot of silver Peugeot parked in Biggar Road.

Vandalism
